ENFORCEMENT BUREAU'S  
SUPPLEMENTAL STATUS REPORT

1. The Enforcement Bureau, pursuant to the Presiding Judge's *Order*, FCC 08M-25 (released April 22, 2008), hereby submits this further status report<sup>1</sup> to the Presiding Judge regarding proposed new procedural and hearing dates in this proceeding. In his referenced *Order*, the Presiding Judge directed counsel to consult on new procedural and hearing dates after Seattle Police Department Detective Robert A. Shilling, Jr., a Bureau witness, had fully recovered from surgery.

2. The Bureau is pleased to report that Detective Shilling has recovered from his surgery. Detective Shilling has informed Bureau counsel that the first available time that he will be able to travel to Washington, DC, to testify in this proceeding is in July. Based on this information, Bureau counsel have conferred with Mr. Titus' counsel about a

proposed new hearing schedule. As a result of such discussions, the parties tentatively propose the following new dates:

Hearing, to commence in Washington, DC, on Tuesday, July 8, 2008.  
Admission Session, to be held on Monday, July 7, 2008.<sup>2</sup>

3. Both the Bureau and Mr. Titus's counsel are in the process of conferring with prospective witnesses to ascertain their availability on these dates. As soon as the parties have more information, they will communicate such to the Presiding Judge.


