On May 21, 2008, Larry Page, President of Products and co-founder of Google Inc. (“Google”), along with Alan Davidson, Senior Policy Counsel, and the undersigned, met with Commissioner Michael Copps, and Legal Advisors Rick Chessen, Scott Deutchman, and Bruce Gottlieb, to discuss the TV white spaces proceeding. During the meeting Mr. Page explained that Google sees tremendous potential in the white spaces spectrum as a means of providing ubiquitous, low-cost broadband Internet access to consumers, without interfering with other legitimate users of the spectrum bands. Mr. Page also described his vision of universal broadband access as a tangible national goal that can help boost the development of viable technical solutions. Additional discussion centered on Google’s enhanced protection proposal in the record.
