PLEADING CYCLE ESTABLISHED FOR TON SERVICES, INC. PETITION FOR DECLARATORY RULING ON A PRIMARY JURISDICTION REFERRAL

On May 2, 2008, TON Services, Inc. (TON Services) filed a petition for declaratory ruling to resolve issues that the United States District Court for the District of Utah referred to the Commission.¹ Specifically, TON Services asks the Commission to determine: "(1) whether Qwest's procedural violations of the Commission's orders implementing the anti-discrimination provisions of 47 U.S.C. § 276(a) (including failure to file cost studies with state public utility commissions ('PUCs') and to obtain PUC approval of its public access line ('PAL') rates as compliant with the new services test ('NST')) constitute violations of 47 U.S.C. §§ 201(b), 276(a) or 416(c); (2) whether Qwest's PAL rates from 1997 to 2002 were substantively NST-compliant; and (3) the proper measure of damages if Qwest's 1997-2002 PAL rates were not NST-compliant."²

Interested parties may file comments on the TON Services petition for declaratory ruling on or before **June 4, 2008** and reply comments on or before **June 16, 2008** pursuant to sections 1.415 and 1.419 of the Commission's rules.³ Filings in this proceeding should be captioned "In the Matter of Petition of TON Services, Inc. for Declaratory Ruling on a Primary Jurisdiction Referral" and filed in CC Docket No. 96-128.

This Public Notice establishes certain procedural requirements relating to consideration of the TON Services petition for declaratory ruling. This matter shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's *ex parte* rules.⁴ Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentations must contain summaries of the substance of the presentations and not merely a listing of the subjects discussed. More than a one- or two-

sentence description of the views and arguments presented generally is required.⁵ Other rules pertaining to oral and written *ex parte* presentations in permit-but-disclose proceedings are set forth in section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.⁶
