

As an agent for the our customers over the past few weeks we have been urgently trying to arrange alternate service for the above customers; however due to the large number of customers effected by the CTI/Starvox action we have been unable to secure alternate service arrangements by the April 17 date. We are currently working with Excel Communications to provide new service to our customers; however the issue with porting customer numbers to the Excel Network has prevented establishing new service in a timely manner without disrupting the customer's daily business. Therefore; we are seeking additional time to transition Integrated VoIP Solutions customers to the Excel Network. It is our estimation this can be completed within the next 30 business days.

Failure to be granted the extra time would result in the customers listed above from doing daily business operations. Any actions you can take on your part to prevent disruption of service would be appreciated.
