Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 2, 2008, Thomas Sugrue and Kathleen O'Brien Ham of T-Mobile USA ("T-Mobile"), Howard Symons of Mintz, Levin, Cohn, Ferris, Glovsky and Popeo, P.C., and Thomas Dombrowsky (Engineering Consultant) of Wiley Rein LLP met with Aaron Goldberger, legal advisor to Chairman Martin, and Brent Greenfield of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau to discuss T-Mobile's concerns about operations in the AWS-3 spectrum and reiterated the need for power limits and out-of-band emission protections to protect existing AWS-1 licensees.

In particular, T-Mobile noted that mobile-to-mobile interference issues, which would occur by allowing AWS-3 spectrum to be used for mobile operations, are extremely difficult to resolve.

T-Mobile also noted its recent launch of AWS-1 broadband operations in the New York market and its plans to launch service in other markets during 2008, arguing that its significant investments in spectrum rights, mobile equipment, and infrastructure must be protected from harmful interference by AWS-3 spectrum license holders. T-Mobile also pointed out that interference protection is essential to T-Mobile's ensuring the high quality wireless broadband services that consumers demand.
