Pursuant to Section 1.1200, et seq., of the Commission's Rules, National Public Radio, Inc. ("NPR") hereby notifies the Commission of the following *ex parte* presentation in the above-referenced proceedings.

On Wednesday, June 4, 2008, Mike Riksen, NPR Vice President for Policy and Representation, Julie Kearney, NPR Director of Public Policy and Legislation, and John Crigler, on behalf of the Station Resource Group and the National Federation of Community Broadcasters, met with Rick Chessen, Senior Legal Advisor to Commissioner Copps, regarding public radio's concerns over the regulatory proposals in the localism proceeding (MB Docket No. 04-233) and the enhanced disclosure proposal in the digital audio broadcasting proceeding (MM Docket No. 99-325). The parties discussed why public radio stations are, by design and operation, uniquely committed to serving their local communities and why the localism and enhanced disclosure proposals, although well-intentioned, would detract from public radio's ability to ascertain local needs and interests and broadcast locally responsive programming.
