Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 4, 2008, Mark A. Stachiw of MetroPCS Communications, Inc. ("MetroPCS"), along with Carl W. Northrop and Michael Lazarus of Paul, Hastings, Janofsky & Walker LLP, participated in a meeting with Julius Knapp, Ira Keltz, Jamison Prime, Patrick Forster, Nicholas Oros, Ahmed Lahjouji, and Geraldine Matisse of the Office of Engineering and Technology to discuss the above-referenced proceedings.

In these meetings, MetroPCS made an oral presentation consistent with the pleadings filed on its behalf in the above-referenced proceedings and the interference-related issues raised in the *ex parte* letter filed by MetroPCS in these proceedings on May 29, 2008. In addition, MetroPCS advocated that: (1) OET should consider the possible interference-related benefits of moving the 5 MHz base transmit portion of the AWS-2 J Block from 2175-2180 MHz to 2155-2160 MHz and shifting the AWS-3 Block from 2155-2175 MHz to 2160-2180 MHz. This change would put the base transmit portion of the J Block adjacent to the base transmit frequencies for the A through F channels in the AWS-1 band and thereby facilitate the development of mobile units better able to avoid interference through the use of front-end filters operating within a narrower frequency range, and (2) OET should advocate interference testing prior to a final allocation of the AWS-3 band in order to have the best possible record upon which to resolve the conflicting interference-related claims being made by interested parties.

No written materials were distributed at the meetings.
