

## WAGA-Atlanta, GA

### I. PROGRAMMING

- c. **Local News Stories:** Some important local stories covered by WAGA during the report period are as follows:
- *Health Watch:* WAGA broadcasts medical-related programming during the newscast Monday through Friday, including stories

about women and heart attacks, cancer vaccines, Bird Flu fears and tainted tissue sales

- *Wednesday's Child*: In partnership with the Freddie Mac Foundation and the Georgia Department of Human Resources and the Office of Adoptions, a story is aired every Wednesday featuring a child with special needs who is available for adoption. More than 60 children have been adopted since the program was established.
- *I-Team*: A team of WAGA reporters who investigate stories of local interest. Investigations aired during the report period include:
  - Health inspection records at Atlanta's airport restaurants
  - Indictment of a state Revenue Department employee who was directing state purchases to companies controlled by himself and his family
  - Voter fraud in a Chattooga County judicial race, leading to a state investigation
  - Underage drinking on university campuses

- d. Political Coverage: WAGA provides comprehensive coverage of debates, town hall meetings and public forums, including:
- Debate in Albany among the four Democrat candidates for governor of Georgia. FOX 5's Russ Spencer was a panelist.
  - Debate between candidates for the 4th District Congressional seat between incumbent Cynthia McKinney and Hank Johnson. The debate was moderated by FOX 5's Morse Diggs and broadcast on GPTV and C-Span.
  - Democrat candidates for lieutenant governor square off a debate broadcast on GPTV. The report on the debate included sound from both candidates. FOX 5's Morse Diggs moderated the debate.

#### IV. **WEBSITE**

WAGA-TV launched the station's website, *myfoxatlanta.com* in August 2006. The website provides extensive news, weather and traffic information, including live streaming of local newscasts, major news events and emergency weather information. Segments from each WAGA newscast are archived on the site and made available for viewing at any time. Text versions of local and national news stories are added to the site throughout the day. The website also offers stories on business, health, entertainment and sports information. Many on-air personalities contribute to the blog section of the website. Live chat pages are available, where users can communicate with one another, as well as interact with WAGA employees. Users have the opportunity to express their opinions by voting on a variety of poll questions on topics related to news and popular culture. Additionally, *myfoxatlanta.com* provides a calendar of community events in the metro Atlanta area, job and internship opportunities at WAGA, and information about the DTV transition in February 2009.

- Police in Clayton County say a woman was targeted by a robber soon after withdrawing a large amount of cash from the bank. The woman says she had a flat tire soon after driving away from the bank, then was robbed by a man pretending to be a Good Samaritan. Police say the incident should serve as a warning to others to exercise caution. (11/4/05)
- A woman became the victim of an armed robbery just after buying one of the hottest toys of the holiday season in Morrow. Police say it appears the robber watched the victim make her purchase, then followed her home and robbed her at gunpoint as she went into her home. (11/22/05)
- April is Sexual Assault Awareness month and Dr. Sarah Cook will be here to talk about the Georgia Network to End Sexual Assault and its efforts to advocate for social and legislative change, educate, and offer standardized services. The network is made up of 21 metro area rape crisis centers. Some of the month's activities include a fundraiser and displays of t-shirts by victims. (3/29/06)
- Gwinnett County police are searching for a man who they say kidnapped a woman, assaulted her, then kept her captive until the next day. Police have identified a suspect, and they are circulating a photo of the man they are trying to find. (6/16/06)
- Cobb County police are investigating a string of burglaries in a Vinings neighborhood. In one burglary, valuable information was taken, and now the FBI is involved in the case. Investigators hope surveillance video from a McDonald's restaurant will help solve the burglaries. (10/22/06)

- A three year old child is hospitalized after being shot while riding in a car in DeKalb County. Police say his father was driving when the gunfire began. Pedestrians ran for cover, and others driving in the area crashed their cars after the shots were fired. (12/1/06)
- An elementary school teacher has been arrested in connection with a large drug seizure. The third grade teacher was taken into custody when officers discovered marijuana at a Clayton County home. (1/23/06)
- Rockdale County deputies say they discovered a stash of cocaine hidden in cheap rubber sandals. Investigators seized six kilograms of cocaine, worth about \$120,000. Deputies say it is the largest drug seizure in recent memory in the county. (1/24/06)

#### 6. Diversity/Race Relations:

- A new effort is underway to solve a mass lynching in Georgia in 1946. Four African-Americans were killed by a white mob in Walton County. The killers were never found. But some believe they are still alive, and should be prosecuted. (11/11/05)
- Atlanta's Human Relations Commission has ruled against a former pilot from Atlantic Southeast Airlines who claimed he was forced from his job by harassment after revealing that he is homosexual. The company claims the pilot's job performance was poor. The former pilot is now taking his complaint to the Federal Aviation Administration. (12/21/05)
- As the celebration of the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday begins, some Georgia leaders are using the occasion to criticize the state's new law requiring voters to show photo identification at the polls. Critics of the law say it discriminates against poor and minority voters. They say the law undermines one of the causes Dr. King championed: protecting the right to vote. (1/13/06)
- The mother of a young man found dead hanging from a tree is demanding a federal investigation of the death. The Georgia NAACP is supporting her request. Local investigators have ruled the death a suicide, but the mother believes her son was murdered, and believes the case may involve race. (2/15/06)

#### 7. The Economy

- A state program intended to help older Georgians pay their home heating bills is being flooded with applications. The rush is on in the wake of predictions of big increases in the costs of home heating this winter. A number of older Georgians say they are concerned that the state program will run out of money. (11/11/05)
- General Motors has announced plans to close the automaker's assembly plant in Doraville, just outside Atlanta. The plant has been in

operation for decades. The closure will lead to hundreds of layoffs in the Atlanta area. (11/12/05)

- Pilots at Atlanta-based Delta Air Lines have voted to accept a temporary pay cut to help the airline reorganize after declaring bankruptcy. The pilots' union has accepted a 14 percent pay cut to ease the company's cash flow problems. (12/28/05)
- The Georgia House has approved a proposal to reduce taxes on natural gas bills. The idea has the backing of Governor Sonny Perdue. It is one part of his plan to help Georgians cope with higher energy costs this winter. The tax break could save Georgia consumers \$15 million. (1/11/06)
- AT&T has reached agreement to buy Atlanta-based BellSouth. The deal would create the nation's largest telecommunications company. But the transaction would mean that Atlanta would lose a major corporate headquarters. Cingular Wireless, which is a joint venture between AT&T and BellSouth, would remain based in Atlanta. (3/6/06)

#### 8. Homelessness/Hunger

- The organization Hosea Feed the Hungry and Homeless offered a Thanksgiving Day meal to the needy throughout the Atlanta area. About 15,000 people came to Turner Field to enjoy the dinner, as well as showers and haircuts offered by the organization. The group is also asking for volunteers and donations to benefit their efforts to aid the homeless year-round. (11/24/05)
- Sherrie Snipes-Williams is a representative from Samaritan House in Atlanta. Samaritan House is committed to aiding homeless men and women get their lives on track through self-sufficiency programs such as goal-setting sessions, internet job searches, resume development classes and interview workshops. We'll also be joined by Charles Heard, a participant from Samaritan House who has benefited from the program. (12/26/05)
- Bishop Eddie Long leads New Birth's Community Outreach Initiative. The program was developed to assist metro-Atlanta's homeless community. Rockdale County deputies say they discovered a stash of cocaine hidden in cheap rubber sandals. Investigators seized six kilograms of cocaine, worth about \$120,000. Deputies say it is the largest drug seizure in recent memory in the county.

An elementary school teacher has been arrested in connection with a large drug seizure. The third grade teacher was taken into custody when officers discovered marijuana at a Clayton County home.

Police at the University of Georgia say a new crackdown on underage drinking on campus has been effective. Atlanta's Human Relations Commission has ruled against a former pilot from Atlantic Southeast Airlines who claimed he was forced from his job by harassment after revealing that he is homosexual. Local civil rights leaders are unveiling plans for the celebration of the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday. They are trying to emphasize what they describe as Dr. King's legacy of peace. Minority police officers were excluded from enrolling in the pension program until the mid 1970s.

Pulitzer Prize winning author Taylor Branch will join us to talk about his new book - *At Canaan's Edge: America in the King Years 1965-68*. It's the third in a trilogy of books that include *Parting of the Waters* and *Pillar of Fire*. This latest book chronicles his efforts to hold his movement together in the face of internal friction, FBI harassment and the Vietnam War - all the way to Memphis in April 1968.

State lawmakers are considering a proposal to deny benefits to adults who are in the U.S. illegally. Critics of the proposal say it discriminates against people of Hispanic origin.

2/22 10pm 2:28

The NAACP and a Paulding County mother are asking for an independent investigation into claims of harassment against her and her children. Three of her children were arrested after a confrontation with neighbors and police. The mother claims police should have arrested some of her white neighbors instead.

2/24 GDA 4:15

There's a new book out, examining the true effects of racism on successful Black professionals. It's called, "*The Black Elite: Still Facing the Color Line in the Twenty-First Century*," and we'll be joined today by the author, Lois Benjamin. In this new edition of a ground-breaking study, Benjamin updates her previous, extensive research on professionally

successful African-Americans. She uses the interview format to shed new light on the seemingly impenetrable world of the elite, and concludes that race still matters in both the daily and long-term struggles of African-Americans in terms of family, personal identity and careers.

State legislators are debating a proposal to reinstate Georgia's hate crime law. The Georgia Supreme Court threw out an earlier version of the law, ruling that it was overly broad. Supporters hope to get a new version of the law on the books during the current legislative session.

A group of customers protested outside an Applebee's Restaurant in Cartersville. The protestors say they were discriminated against because of their race. The restaurant manager says race was not the issue, and that the company has taken disciplinary action against employees involved in the incident.

4/10           12pm           40:00

Tens of thousands of people have gathered for what they are calling a campaign for immigrant dignity. They say Hispanic immigrants in Georgia are the victims of bias because of their ethnic background. They are also opposed to state and national efforts to crack down on illegal immigration.

4/10           GDA            4:00

Dr. James Tabor -chair of Religious Studies at UNC Charlotte talks about his controversial new book - The Jesus Dynasty: The Hidden History of Jesus, His Royal Family and the Birth of Christianity. Based on years of archeological study and analysis of the Dead Sea Scrolls, Tabor challenges traditional thought by arguing that Jesus - a royal descendant of the House of David, proclaimed himself to be a kingly leader of the Jews and that, together with kinsman John the Baptist, had an agenda to return the nation of Israel to God, overthrowing earthly powers. He says what we know as Christianity was founded by the Apostle Paul who never knew Jesus prior to his crucifixion.

Greg Mortenson, author of "Three Cups of Tea, One Man's Mission to Fight Terrorism and Build Nations, One School at a Time" Mortenson builds schools--particularly for girls--in Pakistan and Afghanistan for villages too poor to afford the expenses associated with education and/or who would otherwise have access to only the extremist education offered by the Taliban.

4/21           10pm           2:15

The local NAACP is accusing Cobb County police of using excessive force in the case of a man who died in custody. Two separate investigations are underway into the death of Alfred Fleming. But NAACP leaders say they want an outside agency to review the case.

4/26 GDA 3:50

Go cruising with America's Favorite Funny Lady Rosie O'Donnell. In 2004, Rosie and Kelli O'Donnell and their four kids joined 1500 other families - gay and straight, young and old - on the first ever gay family cruise, a seven day trip to the Caribbean on one of the world's largest cruise ships. Rosie has made a documentary for HBO about the experience and prejudices they encountered.

5/1 5pm 5:00

Thousands of protestors rallied at the Georgia capitol to show their opposition to tougher immigration laws. Demonstrators say the proposals are evidence of bias against Hispanic immigrants.

5/3 5pm 2:06

Protestors gathered at the Centers for Disease Control to call attention to what they believe to be discrimination against African-American employees there. In the last four years, nearly 200 CDC workers have filed complaints with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. They say CDC leaders have ignored their concerns. The CDC says it values diversity in the workplace.

5/11 6pm 1:59

A judge reduced the prison sentence for a former Morehouse College student convicted of beating a fellow student with a baseball bat in what some believe was an attack motivated by hate. The attacker apologized to the victim for his actions. The victim said while he accepts the apology, he was disappointed by the judge's decision.

5/15 GDA 4:30

Former Atlanta Falcon Esera Tuaolo talks about his book - Alone in the Trenches. In it, he recounts his impoverished childhood as a Samoan immigrant, his football career in college and the NFL and his coming out as a gay man - the first in the National Football league.

5/17 5pm 2:42

A Fulton County judge has thrown out a constitutional amendment barring same-sex marriages in Georgia. Opponents of the amendment say it discriminates against homosexuals. They argued that the amendment approved by voters in 2004 improperly dealt with more than one subject, and the judge agreed.

5/22 GDA 4:15

In 1967, Ron Blomberg became the first openly Jewish player to ever play for the New York Yankees and the first designated hitter in major league baseball. The Atlanta native shares his story and the controversies he's faced over time.

5/30 GDA 3:23

Joseph Phillips discusses his new book, "He Talk Like a White Boy: Reflections on Faith, Family, Politics and Authenticity." As a young student, Philips heard someone say, "He talk like a white boy!" and the phrase remained with him for years. The criticism (namely, speaking correctly), suggested a tendency for blacks to challenge the authenticity of other blacks based on their choice of words, music, sports, and style.

6/11 10pm 2:11

A former White County high school student has filed a federal lawsuit against the school system, challenging its policy on school clubs. The teenager claims the school system is improperly preventing a club known as the Gay-Straight Alliance from meeting on campus. The lawsuit describes the policy as discriminatory.

6/24 10pm 2:17

A collection of historic papers from the civil rights movement will be permanently housed in Atlanta. The papers from the estate of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. were to be put up for auction in New York. But an agreement has been reached for the collection to be displayed at Morehouse College instead.

6/25 10pm 2:19

Thousands marched or watched the Pride Parade in Downtown Atlanta, a demonstration in support of gay rights. The march comes just days before the state Supreme Court is to hear arguments on the legality of a constitutional amendment barring same-sex marriage in Georgia.

7/6 6pm 2:00

The Georgia Supreme Court has ruled that the state's constitutional amendment banning same sex marriage is legal. The decision overturns a lower court ruling that said the amendment violated the state constitution. Critics of the amendment say it discriminates against gay and lesbian couples.

7/24 10pm 1:49

African-American activists in Georgia are planning to re-enact an unsolved 1946 lynching at the Moore's Ford Bridge in Walton County. They are calling for a renewed investigation into the lynching. There is a \$27,000 reward being offered for information about the murders.

8/7 GDA 3:30

"Secret Daughter" tells the story of a little girl whose black father was an entertainer and whose white mother an aspiring actress. The couple parted soon after the girl was born and when the child grew too dark for

the mother to "pass her off" as white, she left the girl to be raised by a black family in New Jersey. "Secret Daughter" is an award-winning documentary and now, it's a highly-anticipated memoir. We'll be joined by June Cross, the "Secret Daughter."

8/9            10pm            2:27

Leaders of Georgia's Hispanic community are concerned about a recorded threat of violence. The message was left at the headquarters of an organization that is encouraging Hispanics in Georgia to vote. Authorities say the message could be considered a terroristic threat.

A key member in one of the civil rights movement's most notorious and controversial group speaks out. Flores Forbes has written a book entitled, "Will you Die for Me? The Georgia House has approved a proposal to reduce taxes on natural gas bills. The idea has the backing of Governor Sonny Perdue. It is one part of his plan to help Georgians cope with higher energy costs this winter. The tax break could save Georgia consumers \$15 million.

1/12           10pm           2:26

A staff member from Georgia's Public Service Commission is offering advice to residents looking for ways to save money on their natural gas bills this winter. The PSC recommends shopping around among Georgia's natural gas providers, trying to identify the best rate plan based on their gas usage. Low income Georgians are also eligible to apply for assistance to pay their home heating bills.

Ford Motor Company is preparing to announce a major restructuring plan. Auto industry analysts believe that plan could lead to the shutdown of Ford's assembly plant in the metro Atlanta area. Leaders in Hapeville, where the plant is located, say its closure would be a blow to the economy, but say they are prepared to deal with it.

Some of Georgia's largest employers are making significant cutbacks, which could have a major impact on the state's economy. For the first time in two decades, the state's unemployment rate is higher than the national average. State leaders are looking for ways to assist workers who may be losing jobs at companies including Delta, GM and Ford.

Pilots at Delta Air Lines are preparing to hold a strike authorization vote. Leaders of the pilots' union are threatening to strike if the company wins permission to cancel its contract with the pilots and impose significant pay and benefit cuts. A panel of arbitrators will soon hold hearings on the company's request to void the contract.

AT&T has reached agreement to buy Atlanta-based BellSouth. The deal would create the nation's largest telecommunications company. But the transaction would mean that Atlanta would lose a major corporate

headquarters. Cingular Wireless, which is a joint venture between AT&T and BellSouth, would remain based in Atlanta.

3/13            5pm            1:52

The South Korean automaker Kia has announced plans to build an assembly plant in Troup County. The plant is scheduled to open in August 2008. The plant is expected to bring 5,500 new jobs to the state.

3/17            6pm            0:25

Georgia Power is asking the state Public Service Commission for permission to raise rates. The electric company says it needs to raise rates to offset its increased costs for natural gas in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina. If the request is approved, the average monthly bill in Georgia would increase by about seven dollars.

3/24            5pm            2:16

Thousands of Hispanics in Georgia participated in a work stoppage today, and stayed away from businesses they normally patronize. The move was intended to demonstrate the importance of Hispanics to the state's economy. Leaders of the work stoppage say they want lawmakers to reconsider a plan to crack down on illegal immigration.

3/26            10pm           2:18

A last-minute contract agreement averted a potential strike against Atlanta-based Cingular Wireless. The union representing customer service employees at the telecommunications company had complained that workers are paid less than those at competing companies. The contract agreement covers 11,000 employees in nine southeastern states.

4/3            GDA            3:00

Local real estate expert Rhonda Duffy shares here take on Atlanta's real estate market. With interest rates doing a dance, people are wondering now more than ever: Is the escalating real estate market finally dying down? Should we sell? Should we buy? Will the market crash? Delta pilots have voted to authorize a strike against the bankrupt airline. Atlanta-based Delta is asking pilots for another round of wage concessions as it struggles to reorganize.
