

## WFXT - BOSTON, MA

*This report covers the time period November 1, 2005 to October 31, 2007*

*(except where otherwise specifically noted).*

### I. PROGRAMMING:

- a. **Local Newscasts:** WFXT-TV airs **33 hours** of local newscasts every week:

Monday - Friday: 5 a.m. - 9 a.m.

Monday - Friday: 5 p.m. - 5:30 p.m.

Monday -Friday: 10 p.m. - 11:30 p.m.

Saturday - Sunday: 10 p.m. - 11 p.m.

Sunday: 9 am. - 10 a.m.

- b. **Breaking News:** WFXT broke into and/or preempted regularly scheduled programming on numerous occasions during the period covered by this report in order to bring its viewers breaking news or disaster information. This coverage included extended reporting on severe weather warnings, amber alerts, school closings, and other emergencies. A comprehensive list of cut-ins and crawls is attached as Exhibit 1.

- c. **Local News Stories:** Provided below is a brief summary of local news stories aired during the report period:
- Big Dig tunnel collapse: extensive reporting of the deadly roof collapse in a Big Dig tunnel, leading to in-depth investigations into accountability, structural integrity and interviews with experts
  - Health: Numerous reports about local impact of nurse shortage, preventing cancer, prolonging life (*Living Well*), etc.
  - Illegal immigration: Fox25 covered the local and national debate about illegal immigration and the "Boycott Massachusetts" initiative due to Senator Kennedy's stance on the issue
  - Rhode Island nightclub fire: Reports on the sentencing of nightclub owners, reaction from victims and their families, and discussions about disaster documents made public
  - Gangs: several stories about gang activity in the Boston area, the proclivity of gang-related violence and the emergence of computer-savvy gang members using the internet to recruit new accomplices.

WFXT also produces in-house and airs several segments of local interest:

- *Fox25 Special Reports* - investigative team of reporters evaluates consumer products and local businesses
- *Monday Morning Quarterbacks* -two former state officials talk about the latest political issues on Beacon Hill and other stories of local interest
- *Guy from Boston*: Weekly report by outspoken comedian, discussing issues that “people think about but don’t say,” including coverage of opening day at Fenway Park, cooking lessons, and other local events.

d. **Political Coverage:**

WFXT has devoted extensive coverage to political issues important to its viewers. During the report period, WFXT aired pieces about Senator Kennedy’s stance regarding illegal immigration leading to a “Boycott Massachusetts” initiative by conservative groups, the Iraq war, and the Presidential election (including Republican candidate Mitt Romney, former Governor of Massachusetts).

WFXT also airs monthly interviews with the Mayor of Boston and the Massachusetts Attorney General.

## II. PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS (PSAS):

For the January 08-21, 2007 period, 114 **minutes** of free PSAs were aired about mentoring, the Armed Services, energy conservation, education, crime prevention, drunk driving prevention, health, exercise/diet, high school drop out prevention, federal student aid, mental health, diabetes prevention, and a winter coat drive. Another 77 minutes of paid PSAs were aired in this period regarding energy assistance (help paying for home heating oil) and the Breast Cancer 3 Day Walk.

For the June 11-24, 2007 period, 107.5 **minutes** of free PSAs were aired about the Armed Services, crime prevention, education, energy conservation, health, exercise/obesity and child abuse prevention, 911-World Trade Center Memorial, smoking prevention, drunk driving/reckless driving prevention, literacy and parenting.

PSAs specifically targeting or requested by community groups or addressing local issues for the January 08-21, 2007 period on behalf of National Mentoring Month (Massachusetts mentoring project), Juvenile Diabetes Research Prevention, winter coat drive for people in need, drunk-driving prevention, Amber Alert, identity theft, Darfur-genocide, and federal aid for college students. For the period of June 11-24, 2007, minutes was aired for literacy/reading - local children's book drive. drunk driving and reckless driving prevention, identity theft, and child abuse prevention.

## III. PARTICIPATION IN COMMUNITY

WFXT's management, on-air talent and behind-the-scenes employees have made a commitment to participate in a variety of events in and around the city, such as:

- Speaker, American Heart Association's Cultural Health Festival
- Host, Light of Compassion Gala, Beacon Hospice
- FOX25 Meteorologists make numerous presentations at elementary schools in the area about "How Weather Works."
- Emcee, MLK Great Hall Tribute, City of Boston
- Panelist, URI Journalism Alumni Round Table

WFXT also seeks community input. It communicates informally with viewers, community action programs, volunteers, public servants, citizens, youth, and many charitable organizations by telephone, email

and in person. The station also strong commitment to open communication with the public in order to best serve current community needs, issues and interests. Upon request, the station meets with local charities and minority groups to discuss their specific objectives for the community and ensures their activities are adequately represented on the air and in the news.

Through on-going communication with these minority and special interest groups, and through its participation in sponsorships and charitable events, the station maintains its commitment to ensure the interests of the diverse Boston community are represented.

#### IV. WEBSITE

*MyFoxBoston.com* focuses heavily on local content, but also contains regional, national and international stories.

A regular "Feedback" segment on newscasts directs viewers to the site to answer polls and post opinions on the message board. Responses are read on air later in the show. All anchors and reporters blog on a regular basis, discuss their stories (occasionally with embedded video) and weigh-in on the top stories of the day, requesting feedback from the blogging community.

Video is streamed, including live chats, poll, links to related stories, and links to a message board, where people are encouraged to submit opinions. News is also streamed from the station's helicopter.

The Traffic page contains the latest traffic reports for the Boston area. Similarly, the Weather page includes interactive elements, serving as the home for the latest video forecast, and providing links to weather blogs.

News stories are cut from the broadcasts, posted on the website and archived. Packages produced by WFXT reporters are also posted, as well as any interesting video aired.

“Failing School Security” (Part One); Using hidden cameras, revealed lax security at many Massachusetts High Schools; 2-13-07

“Keeping Kids Safe and Secure” (Part Two); Explored ways some schools have found to tighten security; 2-14-07

“Graveyard Crimes” Revealed alleged desecrations and other graveyard crimes by gravediggers working for the Archdiocese of Boston; 2/26/07

“Counselor on Hidden Camera” Caught a state AIDS counselor on tape attempting to sexually assault a woman who was ordered by the court to attend counseling sessions as part of her probation; 4/26/07

“Pedophile Volunteer” Story of a 13-year-old boy from the projects who gets a “Big Brother, but the man who is supposed to be his mentor sexually assaults him for years; 5/14/07

“Cape Cod Oxycodone Doctor Found Guilty” The result of a two-year Fox Undercover investigation. The doctor was sent to jail for prescribing highly addictive oxycodone without legitimate medical necessity; 7/20/07 (AP Award 2008)

“New School Security” Two schools install computer program highlighted in a previous Fox Undercover report on lax school security. Using a national database, the software identifies sex offenders trying to enter schools; 9/12/07

“Failing to Keep Tabs on Sex Offenders” The state removed hundreds of sex offenders from its database supposedly because they had moved out of state. Fox Undercover revealed the state didn’t do a through search and found some of those sex offenders still living in Massachusetts; 9/19/07

Heavy Hitters - LIVE EVERY TUESDAY. Two local media guys weighing in on Politics. (started 2004)

Tolman & Gray - LIVE EVERY THURSDAY. The Democrat and the Republican go head to head talking about local, state and national politics. (started 2004)

Wallace Time - LIVE EVERY FRIDAY. Chris Wallace does a talk back about the week of political topics and what he’ll cover on his Sunday Morning Show. (started 2004)

Ask the AG - LIVE THE LAST THURSDAY OF EVERY MONTH. Mass Attorney General Martha Coakley speaks to us about the latest news coming out of her office - from ID Theft to the Big Dig Lawsuit. (started 2007)

LEGALLY SPEAKING - LIVE THE LAST FRIDAY OF EVERY MONTH (started 2004). Segments focusing on big legal cases. Segments always vary in topic - some examples are Anna Nicole Smith Case, Michael Vick Case, Neil Entwistle Murder Case, etc.

Boston Mayor Tom Menino - LIVE ONCE A MONTH (day of the week changes each month depending on scheduling). Segments always vary in topic - some examples are violence in the city of Boston, Boston’s budgets, First Night in Boston, etc.

Family Works - Live segment at least 2-3 times a month. Segments always vary in topic - some examples are Dealing with Dyslexia in the Family, How to deal with biting children, how to help your kids with school work, getting your kids to help out with chores, etc.

Manage Your Money - Live segment at least 2-3 times a month. Segments always vary in topic - some examples are Tips for Tax Season, How to start a small business, how to build your 401K, etc.

Living Well - Live segment at least 2-3 times a month. Segments always vary in topic - health care topics, helps improve your mind and body, etc.

Presidential Debates - Following every Presidential debate we would re-cap each hour during the Morning Show.

Zip Trips- Live broadcasts every Friday April - August. We go live from a different town every Friday, featuring people, places and history from those towns... always highlighting those communities. (started 2004)

Preview of Boston Mayoral Elections (2 separate segments). Had both candidates on as live guests - talking about up-coming election. Aired 11/7/05

Boston Mayoral Elections. Talked about elections all morning, had taped video of the candidates voting, etc. Aired 11/8/05

Week of November 14th 2005 - College Planning Wk. How to handle college applications and essays, how to deal with the stress, all college related topics.

Tim Cahill / Mass State Treasure was on talking about the State Pension Board and more particularly the William Bulger ruling. Aired 11/30/05

AG Tom Reilly was a live guest on the show speaking about auto insurance rates in Mass. Aired 12/16/05

Holiday Travel Segment. Talked to Travel expert, Peter Greenberg on the best deals during the holiday season, what to look for and the best times to travel for price and for less traffic. Aired 12/23/05

Gov Romney was a live guest on the show, speaking about new legislation regarding healthcare, and also Melanie's Law (a tough drunk driving bill). Aired 12/21/05

Lt Gov Kerry Healy was live on the show discussing a new 11 million dollar gang budget. Aired 12/22/05
