
On Wednesday, June 11, 2008, the following representatives of MSTV and NAB met with Chairman Kevin Martin and Aaron Goldberger, his Wireless Advisor, about the above two merged proceedings: Elizabeth Burns (MSTV Chair and NAB Board member), David Barrett (MSTV and NAB Board member), Michael Fiorile (MSTV and NAB Board member), David Donovan (MSTV President), Victor Tawil (Senior Vice President, MSTV), Bruce Franca (Vice President, Policy and Technology, MSTV), Kelly Williams (NAB Senior Director, Engineering), Ann West Bobeck (NAB Associate General Counsel, Legal and Regulatory Affairs), and the undersigned, counsel for MSTV. Also in attendance was Cecilia Kang, of *The Washington Post*.

The discussion covered

- the use of geolocation technology in all unlicensed devices that would determine where an unlicensed device is located before it could become operational;
- the effectiveness of sensing in the present state of that technology;

- operation of unlicensed devices on first and second-adjacent channels and possible conditions on unlicensed device utilization of such channels in order to limit interference;
- the impact of such operations on licensed (and unlicensed) microphones;
- the possible licensing of white space use as an alternative to unlicensed utilization;
- certification and policing mechanisms to reduce the risk of interference from unlicensed devices, and
- the need for in-depth exploration of these and other technical issues between a small number of broadcast engineers and OET with respect to the effectiveness and sufficiency of various conditions that might be imposed on unlicensed device use of the white spaces spectrum.
