Please accept my apologies for the lateness of this letter, but I wanted to thank you for looking to FamilyLinks when you ran the tragic story about the toddler who died of apparent suffocation at the hands of her mother. As tragic as this story is, it is encouraging to see your station interviewing experts on crisis intervention and mental health issues – in the hopes of preventing a tragedy like this from happening again. I have included a brochure which gives an overview of the various programs and services offered by FamilyLinks and I want to encourage you to contact us again in the event that we can provide some insight into your reporting assignments.

I don't know if you know this, but I also work closely with PJ Kumanchik to schedule interviews with our staff for the KDKA-Radio Morning Program, and we were featured on the Lynne Hayes Freeland show in September.

As you may know, FamilyLinks is a non-profit agency that provides a comprehensive and diverse range of community-based services to children, adolescents, adults, and families living in Southwestern Pennsylvania. Established in 2001 by a merger of The Whale's Tale and Parent and Child Guidance Center, FamilyLinks has built on the strengths and excellent reputations of both organizations to accomplish its *mission to provide a caring link joining resources of families and communities to build hope, health and strength*. With more than 400 professional staff, FamilyLinks touches the lives of over 85,000 people annually at its 17 sites throughout Allegheny County. Its services address a broad range of disability issues including mental health; drug, alcohol, and substance abuse; mental retardation; homelessness; and at-risk youth.

I welcome the opportunity to discuss FamilyLinks with you further and to answer any questions you may have. It would be great to come down to KDKA, meet with you and introduce myself to PJ in person (we've only talked on the phone.) I would like to acknowledge the contribution that Mr. James Lokay recently made at California University of PA. This past weekend (February 22-23, 2008) Mr. Lokay spent his Friday evening and a full day Saturday moderating a "College Bowl" regional tournament.

College Bowl, "The Varsity Sport of the Mind", has a long and illustrious history on television, on radio and on campuses. It is the world famous game of questions and answers played by two teams of competing students. *College Bowl* has provided the arena for the fastest minds in school to demonstrate their great skills under the fire of varsity competition.


From October 10, 1953 through December, 1955, *College Bowl* was on the NBC radio network under the sponsorship of Good Housekeeping Magazine. The moderator was in a New York studio, the students on their own campuses and the entire event connected via three-way phone and radio hookup.

On January 5, 1959, the *College Bowl* program became a network television show. The program's sponsor was the General Electric Company and the program became known as the *GE College Bowl*. It was first hosted by Allen Ludden, then by Robert Earle. It ran 26-39 weeks each year on Saturdays and Sundays until June of 1970.

This was the first time Cal U hosted a regional *College Bowl*. We hosted 11 colleges and University's from Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey and Maryland. The top two teams (University of Maryland- Baltimore County and Seton Hall) will be traveling to the National Championship at Malcaester College in St. Paul, Minnesota.

In closing, Mr. Lokay was extremely professional, spoke well and is very knowledgeable. Mr. Lokay was able to maintain professionalism well into the final rounds of the tournament (at which time the program is extremely quick paced and contestants become very competitive). It was a true pleasure to have Mr. Lokay at our event.





Good Morning Diana,

I hope you had a nice weekend.

I have the figures you asked for in regards to the Angel Tree Program. I've also created a spreadsheet so you can see the breakdown per Corps for ease of reference. Please keep in mind that I did not hear from three of my Corps even after the three e-mails but that's the way it is here. It's often hard to corral all the troops and many are on vacation during this time. I've totaled up all the data (except for the corps who didn't report). I'll tell you what those numbers are and then make a guesstimation as far as the other three Corps totals. You can present whatever info you'd like.

Throughout the Division we helped 42,728 children. I think it would be safe to tell who you're reporting to that we helped 45,000 keeping those other Corps in mind. We collected 164,112 toys overall. If we say 170,000 that should be a safe estimation.

I hope this is what you're looking for. Let me know if you need anything else.

Here is the spreadsheet if you would like something for your records.


