
This letter is being written in support of WSJT 94.1's continued support of the Tampa Downtown Partnership's monthly concert series, Downtown Live after Five.

Danny Thomas dreamed of a hospital where sick children could come for treatment – regardless of race, religion, or a family's ability to pay. He sought to establish an institution where doctors could treat children with life-threatening illnesses, while scientists could conduct research that would ultimately lead to cures. 

- Inviting us and other leaders in the field to record "blue tips," special PSAs that enable listeners to engage in ocean conservation themselves



I am writing this letter to explain how CBS Radio and specifically, El Zol FM, has been a great supporter of the Capital Area Food Bank for the past three years. Prior to their involvement, WHFS filled that role. Each year, El Zol partners with WTTG Fox 5, the Washington Post, Giant Food Inc. and several others to sponsor a region-wide food and funds drive called "Stuff A Truck" that benefits the Capital Area Food Bank and our 700+ partner agencies. We applaud them for their commitment to serving this community.

This food drive has evolved into one of the largest in our community and has netted over 200,000 pounds of food and nearly \$300,000 in cash donations for the issue of hunger since its inception in 2002. Additionally, it is important to us because it educates and engages community members and motivates them to get involved! It is an event we look forward to each year and are ever grateful that it is run so well.

The Capital Area Food Bank is the largest public, nonprofit food and nutrition education resource in the Washington, D.C. Metropolitan Area. Last year, the CAFB distributed 20 million pounds of food, including 6 million pounds of fresh produce, to over 700 partner agencies. The Capital Area Food Bank has served the National Capital Region over 28 years.




