Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 26, 2008, David J. Field, President and Chief Executive of Entercom Communications Corp. ("Entercom") and John C. Donlevie, Executive Vice President and General Counsel of Entercom spoke with Commissioner Jonathan S. Adelstein via telephone to discuss Entercom's concerns consistent with its August 27, 2007 and May 5, 2008 filings in this proceeding regarding the proposed XM-Sirius merger. Entercom urged that the proposed merger was not in the public interest. The following issues were included in these discussions: (i) the proposed merger would create a national monopoly in satellite and will stifle competition in a number of areas; (ii) the proposed merger would not create a fair and level playing field for competing audio services, allocating 25MHz of spectrum in one licensee, which is more than allocation to the entire AM and FM radio bands combined; and (iii) the Commission should carefully vet the allegations raised in the recent filing by the Consumer Coalition for Competition in Satellite Radio before taking any action on the merger application.
