

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On July 16, 2008, the undersigned, accompanied by Michael Petricone, Senior Vice President, Government Affairs, of the Consumer Electronics Association, and Adam Goldberg of Pioneer Electronics, met with Elizabeth Andron, Acting Legal Advisor to Chairman Martin. The subject was CEA's concern with the breadth and implications, for consumers and for competition, of the Petition filed by the Motion Picture Association Of America. Concern was expressed that the powers sought by this Petition as filed would likely be used to the disadvantage of consumers, technology, and competition, and that the Petition did not appear to embrace, accept, or acknowledge any potential limitation on such powers, or any burden or demonstration necessary for them to be acquired.
