

Comments in Dockets 07-52 and 08-7 (filed in both dockets according to requirements for filing in multiple docket cases as prescribed by the FCC.

In re: Comcast network management practices.

Today I saw the press release related to the issuance of the order in FCC 08-183 (not to be confused with DA 08-183 which was a slamming complaint resolution order). It discussed the fact that Comcast had indeed engaged in discriminatory network management practices.

They still are if you believe the statement below, found on an Internet discussion board tonight.

"I have had my email client set up since I (unfortunately) became a Comcast customer over a year ago and never had any problems until today when suddenly I was unable to send emails. I did some searching online and decided to change the port from Port 25 and that did the trick.

Last I saw anything about Comcast and Port 25, they were blocking it for people who were sending an inordinate amount of mail but this was a few years ago and I could not find anything more recent online. Additionally, I do not send an overwhelming amount of mail and as far as I can tell my system has not been compromised so I wonder if Comcast is employing stronger tactics as far as Port blocking goes... Has anyone heard anything?"

I request the FCC investigate the matter of email and Port 25, along with any other ports used for sending or receiving email. This looks like an attempt to skirt the order of August 1, 2008.
