

We need regulation in regards to bulkbilling. I'm in a condominium development where the developer (L.M. Sandler & Son) contracted with Cox Communication for services (internet, phone and cable) for a 25 year period up to 75 years. I never signed a contract to be bound by this. And the contract the developer entered into states that our HOA fees have to pay the bill regardless if others do not. Further, it also specifically states that if the HOA is in default all services will be turned off. And we will not have the ability to have a house phone, cable or internet. In this day and age, that is absurd to think that we could end up with out any services due to this contract that the developer entered into forcing this deal upon homeowners in the development. There is more about this contract that is truly unfair. As an attorney, legal issues may be brought in this case. But regardless, the FCC needs to step in and ban bulkbilling. This practice is deceptive, unfair, and more harmful than helpful.
