On August 13, 2008, Robert Herring, CEO and Co-Founder of WealthTV sent the following message via email to Elizabeth Andrion of Chairman Martin's office:

Elizabeth:

Docket number MB 08-120, regarding Time Warner separating its programming networks from its cable operations, raises two concerns. First, programming complaints may be jeopardized by Time Warner claiming that their programming group is unaffiliated with their cable operations, a sort of "get out of jail free" strategy for Time Warner with respect to carriage access discrimination complaints. Second, there are individuals in both parts of Time Warner's existing origination, namely the cable side and the programming side that may be critical to complaints.

Thus some thought may be needed as to when complaints are processed and if resolution of complaints should be a condition of the spin-off.

Regarding 616 reform, we remain steadfast that the necessary support is in place.
