On August 19, 2008, the undersigned, accompanied by Michael Petricone, Senior Vice President, Government Affairs, of the Consumer Electronics Association (CEA), met with Nancy C. Murphy, Associate Bureau Chief of the Media Bureau; Mary Beth Murphy, Media Bureau Policy Chief, and Brendan Murray, of the Media Bureau Policy Division. The subject was CEA's concern with the breadth and implications of the Petition filed by the Motion Picture Association of America (MPAA). Mr. Petricone and the undersigned expressed CEA's concern that the powers MPAA's members seek through the Petition would likely be used to the disadvantage of consumers, technological innovation, and competition, that the Petition did not appear to place any meaningful limits on the powers sought, and that the MPAA has made no showing of necessity or harm.
