Re: Notification of Substantive Change in the District of Columbia's TRS Program

Dear Ms. Dortch:

This letter is being submitted pursuant to the FCC's requirements set forth in 47 C.F.R. § 64.605(f)(1) mandating that states provide notification of any substantive changes in their Telecommunications Relay Service ("TRS") programs within 60 days of when a change occurs, and to certify that the state TRS program continues to meet federal minimum standards after implementing the substantive change.

In compliance with the aforementioned requirements, the Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia ("DCPSC") hereby notifies the FCC of the DCPSC's selection of Hamilton Relay, Inc. as the District of Columbia's new provider of TRS. Hamilton began processing District of Columbia relay calls on July 13, 2008. Please revise the FCC's Contact List for TRS Complaints¹ to reflect the District's new relay provider. The DCPSC also certifies that its TRS program continues to meet federal minimum standards since implementing the change in providers.
