On September 16, 2008, Jennifer Manner, Diane Cornell, Patricia Cooper, and Gregg Elias, on behalf of the Satellite Industry Association ("SIA"), met with Renee Crittendon, Legal Advisor for Spectrum and International Issues for Commissioner Jonathan S. Adelstein, concerning the above-referenced dockets.

The SIA representatives based their conversation on the attached ex parte letter filed with the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC" or "Commission") on September 11, 2008, in the above-docketed proceedings. As described in the attached statement, SIA reaffirmed its view that satellite services should be an essential and easily accessible component of any public safety communications network and urged the Commission to seek comment on whether it should require more than one device to be satellite-enabled and, if so, what percentage of devices should have that feature.
