On September 16, 2008, representatives of Great Plains Communications, Inc. of Blair, Nebraska, and Consolidated Companies of Lincoln, Nebraska, met with Federal Communications Commission and staff to present views on recent filings by AT&T, Verizon and a coalition including those companies to establish a unified terminating rate and other intercarrier compensation reforms. We also made recommendations on how the FCC should deal directly and narrowly on the D.C. Circuit Court of Appeals remand on ISP-bound traffic.
