Local radio has all but disappeared from the dial in recent decades. LPFM stations may represent one way to bring community voices back to the airwaves.

However, we've witnessed the loss of local radio programming here in Greater Los Angeles. The term "city of license" has ceased to have any real meaning. Most of the smaller, less powerful stations offer foreign language or religious programs. While that is important, it comes at the expense of almost all local general interest content. If these smaller stations abandoned local content, how can we be sure that the LPFM's won't follow the same path and eventually look for the easy money that comes with syndicated shows and/or brokered programming?

Please consider making at least some of these existing smaller stations serve their localities in English again. We need local news and

community involvement, opportunities for local broadcasters to practice

their craft and affordable outlets for local businesses to market their services.
