Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Tuesday, October 7, 2008, Lawrence Krevor, Vice President, Government Affairs – Spectrum, Sprint Nextel Corporation (“Sprint Nextel”), James Goldstein, Director, Spectrum Reconfiguration, Sprint Nextel, and I met with Renee Crittendon, Legal Advisor for Spectrum & International Issues to Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein, to discuss the status of the above-captioned proceeding. In particular, Sprint Nextel expressed support for application in the 900 MHz band of the “interim” interference protection standards currently utilized in the similarly interleaved 800 MHz spectrum environment. Sprint Nextel also described the importance of its continued access to 900 MHz Business/Industrial Land Transportation (“B/ILT”) spectrum via Special Temporary Authority during the 800 MHz band transition. In addition, Sprint Nextel expressed support for a reasonable transition period following the completion of 800 MHz rebanding before the Commission ends the current 900 MHz licensing freeze and implements additional site-by-site licensing in the band.
