Dear Ms. Dortch,

It is wrong to present change and deny protection and reasons for health. If you were a manufacturer of a car and you knew the auto industry couldn't be sued, would that be right for the public? If you were in the food industry and you knew you could not be sued for health reasons, how careful would the food industry be? If you were an honest helpful company, would you even consider a bill with section 704 in the telecommunications act as was done denying the right to health and wellbeing? The wireless industry's petition to further preempt citizens and state and local government in siting colocation antennas in the U.S. is wrong!

It is holocaust to prioritize high speed wireless digital services for HDTV, video transfer and internet above human aliveness. Reject CITA's proposed changes.

I am a victim from the wireless communication industry. I was forced to leave my home in Iowa because I was overexposed in the penetrating emissions. For six years, nine months after a cell tower was activated, I have had to seek remote areas without electro-magnetic radiation. I have lived homeless trying to

find a place for refuge. To broaden the communication frequencies and amplify the power will injure and make ill many more people. More sick days, more hospital expenses, more tired stressed populace.

Do not grant permission for the third and 4th generation wireless to spread. Forbid it to continue. For the current electro-magnetic radiation emissions, I call for the FCC to enact the precautionary principle, to reduce the emissions and to turn it off. If it is needed, run it through cable.

Research does not demonstrate electro-magnetic radiation is absolutely safe. It has disabled me.
