**Re: Ex Parte, WT Docket No. 08-94; Sprint Nextel Corp. and Clearwire Corp.
Seek FCC Consent to Transfer Control of Licenses and Authorizations**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On October 23, 2008, Robert Quinn, Sr. Vice President - Federal Regulatory and the undersigned on behalf of AT&T Inc. met separately with Erika Olsen, Legal Advisor to Chairman Martin, Wayne Leighton, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Deborah Tate and Renee Crittendon, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein, regarding our comments and reply comments in the above referenced proceeding. AT&T summarized its position, as represented in its filings, and further reiterated its view that the Commission should analyze this transaction consistent with the manner in which it has analyzed every major wireless transaction in recent years, taking into consideration in its spectrum aggregation analysis the BRS/EBS spectrum holdings that Applicants clearly admit will be used to provide mobile telephony and broadband services. The Commission should also reject Applicants' claims that their BRS/EBS spectrum holdings are so encumbered and inferior in nature that the Commission's typical spectrum aggregation review is inapplicable or inappropriate.

AT&T also used the attached Clearwire presentations to demonstrate that Clearwire's claims about their spectrum holdings in this proceeding are flatly inconsistent with their external statements to the investment community and others. Elsewhere, as shown in the attached slides, Clearwire claims that this transaction will create a strong national wireless carrier that will enjoy a clear spectrum advantage over its competitors, with an average nationwide spectrum position of greater than 120 MHz. Clearwire also alleges in the attached presentations that the new Clearwire will have a unique spectrum depth that will drive a wide array of enhanced services and new capabilities and support downlink throughput speeds that surpass those provided by competitors in the marketplace.
