Pursuant to a request from the Commission staff, AT&T examined three additional scenarios for comprehensive intercarrier compensation and universal service reform. The attached slides represent estimates of the total access shifts, average SLC increases and a Universal Service fund impact for the different scenarios. The model runs assume that no benchmark is included in the access reform. AT&T supports the Commission's efforts to take definitive steps toward comprehensive reform of both intercarrier compensation and universal service
