Dear Ms. Dortch:

On October 27, 2008, Catherine Avgiris, Senior Vice President and General Manager of Comcast Voice Services and Susan Jin Davis of Comcast Corporation spoke by phone with Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein to discuss issues pending before the Commission in the above-captioned proceedings. During this discussion, Comcast representatives emphasized that transitioning termination rates to cost-based levels over a shorter period of time than ten years would be in the public interest. Comcast also discussed the intercarrier compensation arrangements in place for the termination of facilities-based VoIP traffic and the implications of the Commission's proposed actions. Comcast's representatives stressed that the Commission's existing interconnection rules have been working well and need not and should not be modified at this time. Comcast's representatives explained the importance of transit service to the company's ability to offer ubiquitous termination to its voice consumers. Finally, Comcast's representatives urged the Commission to impose a cap on the overall size of the high-cost fund.
