The Pacific Broadband Telehealth Demonstration Project is a regional project involving many public and private healthcare organizations in Hawaii and the Pacific Region Territories. Coordination is being managed with the management and IT directors of each facility. Group meetings and individual site meetings are being conducted to share and disperse information. The Telecommunications and Information Policy Group together with each respective telecommunication team from the sites are evaluating connection options for the sites.

A wiki site has also been setup with access for each site to contribute information and coordinate efforts.

The network backbone is being designed and will consist of several types of technologies. These technologies include carrier-provided circuits (either clear-channel T1s or IP Data Services) with VPN tunnels, newly installed fiber optics for cross-connection into the existing State backbone with wave division multiplexing, short-haul wireless links, and some other possible technologies which are being considered.

b. Explanation of how health care provider sites will connect to (or access) the network, including the access technologies/services and transmission speeds;

We are currently determining the needs of the various sites, and are exploring the possibilities of connecting some sites via fiber, point-to-point leased services, and short range wireless technologies. These technologies provide various transmission speeds and will be dependant on the needs of the individual sites.

c. Explanation of how and where the network will connect to a national backbone such as NLR or Internet2;

This interconnection to the Internet2 is still being designed and may connect via the University of Hawaii.

The length of fiber construction is being analyzed along with the feasibility of both buried and aerial fiber.

To be determined. We are currently in the process of developing our project plan and schedule. We have begun to identify the major project deliverables which includes: Site assessments, network design, request for proposals, identifying implementation phases, and are currently developing the timeframe for each deliverable. We have begun identifying key technical coordinators/contacts from the various agencies in order to form a technical working group. We have also begun discussing the formation of an Advisory committee which will help to steer the project and keep it on course. We are also creating the letters of agencies for the participating sites. Various WAN technologies are also being looked into, specifically MPLS backbone services, licensed & unlicensed radio, microwave, and free space laser.

The sustainability of the network will be achieved in several ways. First, there are a number of sites that will have a network infrastructure installed that will eliminate monthly recurring costs such as fiber optics and/or wireless technologies. Once installed these facilities will be owned by the project which will make funds available to be reallocated for other network maintenance and/or expansion.

Secondly, many sites are eligible to participate in the regular rural health care program but are not currently participating. By implementing some re-designs in the network, using the funds that are currently allocated for communication costs, and applying for assistance by the regular program, we will be able to support an increased capacity at a lower cost to the participant enabling the continued operation of the network.

Third, in performing the network analysis and design it may be possible to re-route network links to achieve an overall cost savings to selected sites due to the expanded number of participants in the partnership.

And finally the increased network capacity, higher number of participants, and availability of sites allow for the introduction of additional telemedicine services which will contribute to the revenue of participants further enabling the continuation of network services.
