Chariman Martin and all, for months I have been sending information to most of you regarding the Verizon-Alltel deal-docket No 08-95. These many emails have detailed to confirm that Verizon has intentionally and purposely allowed now tens of thousands or more of current and former employees to work with and use carbonless copy paper, ccp, they knew could cause serious injuries, disabilities, cancer and death to employees. Copies of internal Verizon, going back to Bell Atlantic 1991, has not only known of the potential for such adverse health problems, but also showed how Verizon has contacted the manufacturers of the ccp, had received a long list of known chemicals used in the ccp,

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knowledge of high levels of chemicals used in the ccp such as up to 200ppm of formaldehyde found by the manufacturers when the accepted OSHA safe level is .75ppm, almost 300 times higher than the accepted safe level, and dozens of other such data from other chemicals and known adverse health effects, known severe potential adverse health effects, PREPARED WARNINGS TO GIVE TO EMPLOYEES BACK FROM 1991 THAT HAVE NEVER BEEN GIVEN, instead affected employees fired and forced to retire, then denied disability retirement, workers comp and associated benefits and now possibly thousands that have been adversely affected or already died.

This information has been provided to you for review to approve or not approve the Verizon-Alltel deal. Since knowledge of potential class action litigation against Verizon could cost Verizon billions in losses, Verizon would not be able to afford the Verizon - Alltel deal and complete the funding. That could cause a great deal of problems and damages to untold numbers of consumers.

I do not see where any of you have been in contact with Verizon, Alltel, or any of the other parties in order to try and avoid such problems. In addition, as Federal employees, I do not see that any action has been taken by any of you to forward such information to other agencies to protect the health and safety of the employees. This may have caused severe adverse health problems to untold additional employees of Verizon.

Since time is drawing close and according to reports, you are to make a decision tomorrow, November 4, I wanted to make sure that you have taken all this into consideration. I plan to make sure all the data I have provided is on the Public Docket and plan to make the submissions of all the past emails and other data provided submitted to the public docket by late today.

In addition, the DOJ and many state attorney generals have filed litigation in the US District Court of the District of Columbia last week, October 30, 2008. I plan to make submissions to that docket also with all this data, hopefully by tomorrow.

If I am mistaken and you have been in contact with Verizon and other parties to confirm they are making immediate steps to resolve the issues related to the ccp including preparing warnings for all other employees, please let me know right away. If that has been done and I can confirm that, there is no reason for me to make such submissions to the FCC public docket or the USDOJ filings.

I look forward to hearing from you this morning.

Mr. Minion, Randy and all, I called and left a message for most of you this morning. I wanted to make sure that you all understand that documents, emails and other correspondence will be in public view for millions to see on the FCC public docket site for Docket 08-95 the Verizon -Alltel deal as well as the US District Court, DC District in the filing just made Thursday by the USDOJ and many state Attorney Generals. This will clearly show that Verizon, corporate officers, directors and other management at Verizon have intentionally and purposely allowed tens of thousands of current and former employees to work with and use ccp they knew could cause serious injuries, disabilities, cancer and death, purposely did not give the warnings, then fired and forced to retire sick and disabled employees, then denied all benefits, and now is fully aware that a class action is likely to be filed that could cost Verizon billions in related losses which would cause Verizon not to be able to afford the Verizon -Alltel deal. This will make all involved look very bad and could lead to further litigation.

Mr. Minion, I appreciate your response. I will not contact Cerberus at all any more. You misunderstand my reasons for contacting them to begin with. I have been trying to protect Cerberus not extort money or do anything illegal in anyway. Mr. John Snow, Chairman of Cerberus is also a Director of Verizon. As such, Mr. Snow has been made aware of much known information to Verizon, corporate officers ,other directors and others at Verizon of the potential for serious adverse health effects, disabilities , cancer and death from use and exposure to carbonless copy paper. I have provided Mr. Snow and others at Verizon copies of internal documents and many other documents to support claims that Verizon has, going back to Bell Atlantic and no later than 1991 appears to have conspired to keep such information from now tens possibly hundreds of thousands of employees. In addition, there is no way to tell how many employees have been adversely affected, developed disabilities, cancer other adverse health effects and/or already died from use and exposure to carbonless copy paper. By intentionally not warning employees, this appears to be a conspiracy of Verizon, corporate officers, directors, such as Mr. Snow and others at Verizon to intentionally cause such injuries and deaths to employees.

With such information, I have done my best to not only resolve my disability and other related claims but also work with Verizon on the wording of real warnings for all the other possibly hundreds of thousands of employees that have used, been exposed to carbonless copy paper, and suffered potential known adverse health effects, disabilities, cancer and death. That has not happened.

I continue to strive for such goals.

I have informed Verizon, Randal S. Milch, newly named General Counsel of Verizon, my intentions to add such information to the public FCC file of the Verizon - Alltel deal-Public Comment Docket WTB No 08-95 this coming Monday Novemeber 3, 2008. If there are no objections I will also submit this letter as well as hundreds of other emails , correspondance, documents and other data I have provided to Verizon corporate officers, directors and others at Verizon to confirm such claims.

In addition, I advised Mr. Milch of my intention to file a motion with the USDOJ case that was just filed yesterday in the US District Court of the District of Columbia also related to this same case. Attorney General offices in many states have joined the USDOJ filing regarding the Verizon-Alltel deal and have concerns regarding such a deal. In discussions with persons at some of those offices today, I have discussed the issues I am involved with . These offices of Attorney General are interested in this issue and want more data,including being copied with my filing, in order to help protect citizens in their states that may have been adversely affected.

This will mean that Mr. Snow's involvement and his continued intentional refusal to cause warnings to be given to the possibly hundreds of thousand of current and former employees will be made public in many ways now. This may have a negative impact on Cerberus, as I have strived to avoid, for so long as I described. Such public knowledge could have a negative impact on the GM, Cerberus, Chrysler talks. I have strived to avoid such damage to Cerberus.

However, my intentions to help Cerberus to avoid such possible harm has been taken the opposite, as demonstrated by your letters. Once again, it has been my intention to help Cerberus , not threaten or extort.
