Dear Ms. Dortch:

On December 8, Joan Marsh and Jeanine Poltronieri of AT&T met with Bruce Gottlieb, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Copps to discuss the ongoing proceedings involving spectrum at 2155-2180 MHz (the "AWS-3 proceeding") and wireless E911 location accuracy requirements.

Consistent with our filed comments in the AWS-3 proceeding, AT&T expressed its view that the Commission must ensure that appropriate controls are put in place to prevent interference into the AWS-1 band. We also discussed the letter proposal filed by AT&T, APCO and NENA to improve compliance measurements for the Commission's wireless E911 location accuracy rules governing network-based technologies, we asked for support of that proposal and encouraged the Commission to act on the proposal expeditiously.
