Yesterday, December 17, 2008, I met with Donald Stockdale, Marcus Maher, Randy Clarke, and Albert Lewis of the Wireline Competition Bureau. We discussed the two forbearance petitions in the respective dockets referenced above. Embarq reiterated its opposition to the Feature Group IP Petition and its support for the Embarq Petition, emphasizing that all voice traffic should be treated the same on the public switched telephone network (PSTN) irrespective of the technology used to originate or terminate the call. All of Embarq's points were consistent with its prior filings in the above-referenced dockets, and the attached presentation was used in the discussion.
