Thank you for forwarding the letter from Thomas Millender, one of your constituents, in support of requiring any licensee of the 2155-2175 MHz band to provide free and family-friendly broadband service to at least 95% of the U.S. population.

The Commission recently released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking seeking public comment on various proposals, including the ones Mr. Millender supports, for wireless broadband use of the spectrum that is the subject of your letter.
