Thank you for forwarding the letter from Lisa Weatherspoon-Morgan, one of your constituents, in support of requiring any licensee of the 2155-2175 MHz band to provide free and family-friendly broadband service to at least 95% of the U.S. population.

The Commission recently released a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking seeking public comment on various proposals, including the ones Ms. Weatherspoon-Morgan supports, for wireless broadband use of the spectrum that is the subject of your letter. The Commission will consider all relevant information before deciding how to license the 2155-2175 MHz band. A copy of your letter and this response will be placed in the rulemaking docket (WT Docket No. 07-195) so that it will be included in the record for this proceeding.


Dear Chairman Martin:
