This morning, the Presiding Judge received, *inter alia*, emails from MASN (9:57 a.m.); Comcast (10 a.m.); and MASN (11:00 a.m.) concerning compliance with *Order* FCC 09M-19, *i.e.*, production by Comcast to MASN of non-party RSN agreements.


Four objecting RSNs have concerns with disclosures of their confidential information, and request protective order relief. MASN filed an Objection to Oppositions of these four RSNs.¹ MASN also submitted a Status Report on negotiations. Comcast filed its "delayed" Opposition to MASN's previous Motions to Compel. *See Order* FCC 09M-20, released February 26, 2009 (Comcast released from filing on deadline set under *Order* FCC 09M-19).

Now MASN seeks an opportunity to file a next day "short" Reply to Comcast's Opposition. No opposition to MASN's request has been received.

Therefore, as a matter of discretion, under Section 1.294(d), MASN may file by or before 2:00 p.m., March 3, 2009, a Reply to Comcast's Opposition not to exceed five pages.
