On March 17, 2009, Jeneba Ghatt of the Ghatt Law Group LLC and Counsel to the Amici Coalition of Public Interest and Civil Rights Organizations ("Amici Coalition"); Cheryl Johns, Office of Advocacy, U.S. Small Business Administration; Kim Gandy, National Organization for Women Foundation; and S. Jenell Trigg, Counsel to Council Tree Communications, Inc., Bethel Native Corporation, and the Minority Media & Telecommunications Council ("MMTC"), met with Commissioner Jonathan Adelstein, and his Legal Advisor, Renee Crittendon. On March 18, 2009, Jeneba Ghatt of the Ghatt Law Group LLC and Counsel to the Amici Coalition; Cheryl Johns, Office of Advocacy, U.S. Small Business Administration; Angela Ciccolo, NAACP; Kimberly Marcus, Rainbow PUSH Coalition; and S. Jenell Trigg, Counsel to Council Tree Communications, Inc., Bethel Native Corporation, and the MMTC, met with Commissioner Robert McDowell and his Legal Advisor, Angela Giancarlo. The purpose of both meetings was to discuss the FCC's repeal of the designated entity ("DE") Rules, and the Amici Coalition's concerns regarding the lack of diversity and competition in the wireless industry, as expressed in the Amici Curiae Brief filed in *Council Tree Communications, Inc. et al. v. FCC*, Case No. 08-2036 before the Third Circuit, U.S. Court of Appeals. A copy of the Amici Curiae Brief and the Motion for Leave to Participate as Amici Curiae is attached hereto.

The attendees also discussed the poor results and the lack of diversity of the winning bidders in Auctions 66 and 73, the opportunities for small, minority and women owned businesses embodied in the FCC's implementation of a national broadband strategy, and the need to level the playing field now so that current DE licensees can raise money to continue to build and new DEs can start to prepare for the next auctions and raise capital in these tough

Diverse ownership of wireless licenses is very important because today's wireless technology delivers necessary services to people without landline phones as well as important news, entertainment and informational content to the constituents of the organizations represented in the meetings.
