To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing to inform the FCC of actions taken to meet the DTV reporting requirement as a 700 MHz license winner. In compliance with MB Docket Number 07-148, Star Telephone has taken the following actions:

- On April 1, 2008, all customers received an information brochure produced by the Foundation for Rural Service in their monthly statement.
- Beginning May 1, 2008, the following message was placed on each customers monthly statement: “Effective February 17, 2009, full power analog broadcasting will end, and analog-only televisions may be unable to display full-power broadcast programming unless the viewer takes action. Viewers can get more information by going to www.DTV.gov or calling the NTIA at 888-DTV-2009.”
- A link to the FCC DTV website has been placed on the www.stmc.net and www.starvisions.tv website.
- Our cable subsidiary General Manager, Randy Jacobs, attended several community events such as the Older American Month Celebration meeting, the monthly Lion’s Club meeting, and the Kiwanis Club meeting to inform community members of the DTV transition.
- An infomercial was aired featuring Randy Jacobs on the local cable service.

Due to the DTV Delay Act, we have changed the bill message to the following:

“Effective with the passage of the DTV Delay Act, the end of the full power analog broadcasts has been moved to June 12, 2009. Analog-only televisions may be unable to display full-power broadcast programming unless the viewer takes action. Viewers can get more information by going to www.DTV.gov or calling the NTIA at 888-DTV-2009”
