

I am concerned about limiting or penalizing local or national broadcast speakers on religious or political subjects. Criticism by others is good practice only when it does not affect the presenter's coverage, ability or right to broadcast. I consider that broadcast presenters are free to give their opinions under protection of the United States Constitution. Radio or TV broadcasters should not be required to limit programs: to provide free time. nor any priority to those in opposition. Broadcasters should not seek to prevent those in opposition from broadcasting.

My main concern is governmental interference, limiting or punishing speakers from expressing thoughts on religious or political subjects. Local objections, where encountered, should abide by U.S. Constitutional restraints and privileges.
