

- Has TVGuardian technology made a difference in your life and the life of your children? Absolutely; my wife and I do not curse to breed that to our kid's vocabulary. We do not want TV to introduce them to those words as acceptable speak.
- Would you like to see it more widely available? Most definitely – I have contacted TV/Guardian for an updated digital sit-on-top but they are not available yet. The DVD integrated is great for movies, but does not work on TV programming – we all know how loose TV programming has been allowed to get. So I am still using my old sit-on top.
- **The FCC specifically wants to know if the closed-captioning is accurate enough for the TVGuardian technology to be useful** (please mention your experience). The filtering works great on compatible closed-captioning. However, Universal DVD's use a different than standard CC and it does not work. Also, I have noticed that many of my Comcast cable channels do not filter, but if I watch that same movie from Comcast on-demand, it does filter.
- What if TVGuardian technology was not added to these devices and was no longer available at all? That would be sad for those of us who wish not to hear the bad language, but enjoy a good movie, to have to make choices based on what a producer deemed necessary to get a rating. Beethoven is a great family movie; one word inserted towards the end made it PG instead of G. Look how popular Disney movies are at the box office. Consider Fireproof and how popular it was. Great movies do not have to be littered with bad language. I only hope that if more devices do not get integrated with filtering such as TV/Guardian, that TV/Guardian will hurry up and get their own devices back to market. No offence, but the FCC way of filter in the past is V-Chip which totally blocks the movie. With that technology, you could not watch Passion as it was rated R or many other great movies that are rated primarily for their language and contain no nudity or other foul programming – only language. WE SHOULD BE ABLE TO FILTER THAT OUT.
- If you or your children watch TV or movies over the Internet, on a computer, on an iPod, or on a cell phone, please mention how TVGuardian technology would help. Wow wouldn't that be great! But please at least get the main means of family programming entertainment covered first – TV and their attached devices.
- Would you be willing to pay a few dollars each month for the TVGuardian feature in cable/satellite, if that is the only way these companies would offer it? Why not, cable companies are allowed to charge for everything else at their choice. Nothing else seems to be hardly governed as to how and what they charge; why would I expect this to be. However, this is integrated software into the actual equipment – i.e. the cable box. Not sure why it would be legal for the cable company to continuously charge for a one and done activation.

Basically, my family loves TV/Guardian and the freedom that it allows us to watch mass market programming as well as major motion movies in the comfort of our home without having the continuous bombardment of foul language entering the subconscious of our conversation.
