Whidbey Telephone Company (“Whidbey”) is the licensee of Stations WQIZ641 (CMA212 – Channel Block B), WQIZ642 (CMA214 – Channel Block B), WQIZ643 (CMA242 – Channel Block B), WQIZ644 (CMA389 – Channel Block B), WQIZ645 (CMA695 – Channel Block B) and WQIZ646 (CMA696 – Channel Block B) in the 698-806 MHz Band (“700 MHz Band”). Whidbey’s Auction No. 73 long-form application covering those stations was granted by the Commission in June of 2008. See Public Notice, entitled “Wireless Telecommunications Bureau Grants 700 MHz Band Licenses,” DA 08-1522, Report No. AUC-73 (Auction No. 73), dated June 26, 2008.

Pursuant to Section 27.20 of the Commission’s Rules, we hereby report that for the quarter ended March 31, 2009, Whidbey has undertaken the following outreach efforts to educate consumers about the transition from analog broadcast television service to digital broadcast television service (DTV):



Whidbey provides wireline telephone services and is an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier (“ETC”) in the State of Washington. Whidbey has not yet deployed services under its new Auction No. 73 700 MHz licenses.
