Dear Chairman Martin,

It has come to my attention that there are dangerous proposals coming before your committee in The Report on Broadcast Localism and Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, as well as the suggestion of establishing local Advisory Boards to monitor and influence program content on private broadcasting systems. To be sure, there should be room available on the air for political programs of all viewpoints, as well as secular and different religious programs---but none of those programs should be forced to include programming that violates their beliefs, or have to face censorship from a non elected local advisory board. There should not be elected boards to determine what should be free speech. It is ironic that your board should be asked to loosen up on pornographic and foul language regulations, but try and interfere with free speech of a political or religious nature. As thinking Americans, we can seek out both sides on our own and turn the dial if we don't wish to listen to a certain program. The majority of our newspapers and TV news already hold much influence in presenting the liberal view, which is their free speech choice. Please reject the proposed changes to the FCC and allow all Americans to choose for themselves what they want to listen to and support.
