Dear Ms. Dortch:

On April 20th, Bob Quinn, Hank Hultquist, Gary Phillips and Bill Brown of AT&T met with Nicholas Alexander, Legal Advisor to Commissioner McDowell. In that meeting, they reiterated AT&T's support for reducing the interval for intermodal and wireline-to-wireline number portability. In so doing, they pointed to the success of the wireless industry as a model for the efficiencies that can be achieved, and urged the Commission to promote similar efficiencies on an industry-wide basis by ensuring that improvements in the efficiency of number portability benefit consumers irrespective of the identity of their incoming or outgoing service provider.

To achieve this objective, it is critical that the Commission not simply order a reduction in the porting interval. No such reduction can be achieved on an industry-wide, reciprocal basis without development of a streamlined and standardized process. The development of such a process has enabled the wireless industry to routinely accomplish number ports within two hours.

Accordingly, the Commission should direct the industry to develop a uniform, standardized process designed to ensure that the vast majority of intermodal and wireline-to-wireline ports are completed in two days or less. The Commission should further direct the North American Numbering Council to oversee this development and report on its completion within no more than six months.
