Dear Ms. Dortch:

This letter is provided in response to a staff request for additional detail regarding the meeting that the undersigned reported upon in a letter on this subject dated April 16, 2009.

As noted, that meeting took place between the undersigned, representing Harbinger Capital Partners Master Fund I, Ltd. and Harbinger Capital Partners Special Situations Fund, L.P. (collectively, "Harbinger"), Gary Epstein and Christian Gates, of SkyTerra Communications, Inc. ("SkyTerra") and David Furth, Acting Chief, Jeffrey Cohen, Acting Deputy Chief, Bill Lane, Chief Engineer, and Erika Olsen, Special Counsel, all of the Public Safety & Homeland Security Bureau.

In the earlier letter, with respect to the Commission's consultative role to NTIA and RUS on broadband grant and loan programs, we reported that the purpose of the meeting was to discuss SkyTerra's plan to seek stimulus funds for a link-up between public safety broadband networks and SkyTerra's present and next-generation satellite systems.

By way of further explanation, the link-up between public safety broadband networks and SkyTerra's present and next-generation satellite systems would take the form of a public safety broadband network operations center, which could be connected to a SkyTerra earth station facility, in order to:

- enhance interoperability among networks using the public safety broadband spectrum and satellite communications.
- create integrated satellite-terrestrial devices for use on the public safety broadband spectrum.
- create a platform for public safety satellite communications and interoperability among other public safety legacy networks.
- establish an open-architecture platform that supports development of interoperable applications and services.
- support interconnection between the satellite services and public safety networks to ensure redundant, survivable communications;

Representatives of Harbinger and SkyTerra also pointed out that such a proposal would in no way preclude any options that the Commission might consider with respect to the future of D-block or use of the presently-licensed 700 MHz public safety broadband allocation.
