**ORDER**


On 6 April 2009, an informal telephone request was received by OALJ from a non-party asking to film a hearing scheduled for 13 April 2009, et seq., entitled *NFL Enterprises v. Comcast Cable* (Media Bureau Docket No. 08-214).

Recall that Carriage Cases<sup>1</sup> were ordered expedited by the Commission on January 27, 2009. (See *Order* (FCC 09-4)). These Carriage Cases have become laced with tightly negotiated *Protective Orders* considered necessary to secure from disclosure confidential corporate information. As a result, there will be necessary repeated interruptions of testimony during the Carriage Cases that will require temporary closings of the court room to the public. Clearly, the presence of a recording camera would be an added opportunity for inadvertent disclosure of protected data, and would need to be monitored thereby causing distraction and disruption.

Accordingly, under the Presiding Judge's adjudicatory discretion<sup>2</sup>, all parties and the public ARE ON NOTICE that there will be no court room filming permitted in any of these Carriage Cases, at any time.

SO ORDERED.<sup>3</sup>
