During the meeting, the parties discussed the FCC’s rule requiring that Communications Assistants’ identification numbers (“CA IDs”) must be available to public safety answering points (“PSAPs”) via the automatic location information (“ALI”) database. The parties explained that the current rule was not technically feasible, but that providers are able to transmit CA IDs orally, which enables the PSAPs to obtain the information they need in a timely fashion.
