Dear Ms. Dortch:

On behalf of AT&T Inc. (AT&T), Bob Quinn and Jack Zinman met with Julie Veach, Bill Dever and Randy Clarke of the Wireline Competition Bureau to discuss the Commission's proposal to adopt discontinuance requirements for interconnected VoIP providers in the above-referenced docket.<sup>1</sup> Bob Quinn, Jack Zinman and Hank Hultquist also subsequently met with Mark Stone, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Adelstein, to discuss the same topic.

Consistent with our previous filings in this docket, we explained that AT&T is generally supportive of the Commission's goal of ensuring the orderly transition of interconnected VoIP customers to alternative service providers in the event of a discontinuance. We further informed the Commission of AT&T's intention to discontinue its CallVantage VoIP service later this year and we described our plans for notifying affected customers and facilitating their transition to alternative providers.
