Re: Request for Information Concerning Applications of AT&T Inc. and Centennial Communications Corp. For Consent to Transfer Control of Licenses, Authorizations, and Spectrum Leasing Arrangements, WT Docket No. 08-246

Dear Messrs. Menser and Sugrue:

On November 21, 2008, the Commission received applications filed pursuant to sections 214 and 310(d) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the "Act"),¹ seeking Commission approval of the transfer of control of licenses, authorizations, and *de facto* transfer spectrum and spectrum manager leasing arrangements held by Centennial and its subsidiaries from Centennial to AT&T.² In order for the Commission to complete its review of the applications and make the necessary public interest findings under section 310(d) of the Act, we require data from other commercial wireless carriers against which the applicants compete.

Accordingly, pursuant to sections 4(i), 4(j), and 403 of the Act,³ we request that you provide written data as set forth in the Attachment. Your response will be treated as confidential pursuant to the Protective Order issued in WT Docket No. 08-246.⁴ We would appreciate receiving your response no later than May 15, 2009.
