Bretton Woods Telephone Co., Inc. (BWTC) hereby provides notice that it intends to cease offering wireline broadband Internet access service on a tariffed basis. Effective July 1, 2009 BWTC will begin offering wireline broadband Internet access service on a Title II, common carriage, permissive detariffed basis pursuant to paragraph 94 of the Federal Communications Commission's Wireline Broadband Order.¹ The geographic areas affected are those BWTC exchanges where DSL is technically feasible.

Today, the only customer of this service is BWTC's nonregulated affiliate Internet Service Provider ("ISP"). The affiliate purchases wireline broadband access service for use as a component in its broadband Internet service sold to residential and business consumers. End user service provided by the affiliate will not be affected by discontinuance of the tariffed offering by BWTC. As stated in the attached customer notice, BWTC will continue to offer services to existing ISP customer(s) under current rates, terms and conditions until the end of their current term or upon replacement with a Broadband Commercial Agreement. Broadband Commercial Agreements will be made available in a nondiscriminatory manner to any provider desiring to purchase wireline broadband access service for use as a component in its broadband Internet service sold to consumers.

Effective July 1, 2009, BWTC will make its wireline broadband Internet access service on a permissive detariffed, common carriage basis through posting of rates, terms and conditions at www.bwtc.net. (password: g453w) Printed copies will also be available during normal business hours at BWTC's business office located at 171 Mt. Washington Hotel Rd., Bretton Woods, NH 03575.
