Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission's Rules, this letter reports that on May 19, 2009, Mark Brunner, Senior Director Global Public Relations of Shure Incorporated, Troy Tanner and the undersigned as outside counsel to Shure met with Chris Moore, Bill Stafford, Paul D'Ari, Monica DeLong, Nese Guendelsberger, and Brenda Boykin of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau.

During the meeting, Shure reiterated its position as set forth in its Comments and Reply Comments in this docket. We also discussed Shure's view that the Commission can issue an order appropriately addressing the principal issue in this proceeding -- that is, whether and on what terms and conditions secondary low power auxiliary service devices, including wireless microphone systems, should migrate out of the 700 MHz band -- without addressing other issues collateral to the proposed migration including whether and how to reclassify various uses of wireless microphones under the Commission's Part 74 rules.

We also updated the Commission staff on Shure's ongoing voluntary efforts to educate wireless microphone users and dealers about the Commission's proposed changes to rules permitting secondary low power auxiliary service in the 700 MHz band and to encourage use in other spectrum. We noted that Shure's outreach efforts have included, among other efforts, posting information on the company's website and notices in trade magazines advising wireless microphone dealers and users of the proposed transition and opportunities to trade in their 700 MHz equipment for equipment operating in other bands. Finally, we discussed anecdotal marketplace indications that wireless microphone users operating in the 700 MHz band have been discouraged from transitioning equipment and

operations into other bands in the absence of clear guidance from the Commission and by financial pressures resulting from the downturn in the economy and continuing uncertainty over the protection of wireless microphone operations. In this regard, we discussed Shure's position in the White Spaces docket, and left behind a copy of the attached slides describing the existing rules and certain issues in that docket .
