The undersigned counsel, together with Trey Hanbury, Director, Government Affairs, Sprint Nextel Larry Krevor, Vice President of Government Affairs, Sprint Nextel, and Marc Martin of K&L Gates met today with Acting Chairman Michael J. Copps and his legal advisor Paul Murray to discuss the progress Sprint Nextel and the broadcast community have made in transitioning BAS operations above 2025 MHz. We also identified some of the challenges ahead, reiterated a joint request that the Commission establish February 7, 2010 as the new transition date, and request that, to the extent it is practicable, the FCC resolve all outstanding pending matters in the above referenced proceeding.
