On May 28, 2009, Jim Bugel and I, on behalf of AT&T Services, Inc., met with David Furth - Acting Bureau Chief, Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau, Jeff Cohen - Acting Deputy Bureau Chief, Carol Simpson - Acting Associate Bureau Chief, Tim Peterson - Chief of Staff, and (via telephone) Erica Olsen – Special Counsel regarding the above referenced proceeding. During the meeting, AT&T discussed its plans to begin augmenting the AT&T E911 network-based service with E911 Assisted Global Positioning System (AGPS) Service. Throughout this year, AT&T will be activating AGPS in its 3G Network, thereby providing AGPS location estimates from AGPS-enabled handsets in these areas. AT&T will continue to provide network-based Uplink Time Difference of Arrival (UTDOA) locates for the non-AGPS handsets, such that all handsets in the AT&T customer base will continue to receive Phase II service wherever it has been requested by local public safety agencies as such, AT&T shall continue to measure Phase II accuracy compliance as a network-based carrier
